"A Doll's House Pt. 2"

Who's that knocking on the door? Nora is back in this audacious comedy. It's been 15 years since she slammed that same door on her marriage and children in the revolutionary final scene of Ibsen's 1879 ground-breaking masterwork. Now a successful yet scandalous writer, she's being blackmailed by a judge and needs her former husband's help. But her family has a few grievances they need to air first. A blistering and very funny meditation on marriage and the high cost of personal fulfillment.

"Noises Off"

Called "the funniest farce ever written." A joyfully out-of-control British farce about the auspiciously titled play-within-a-play "Nothing On," told in three acts: dress rehearsal, the opening performance and a performance towards the end of an exhausting run. Brimming with slapstick comedy. Step behind the curtain and meet the under-rehearsed and overworked cast and crew as they bring down the house – literally!

"Cry Baby"

Seven years later, this and other snippets of pop culture have become the live entertainment of a post-apocalyptic society, sincerely trying to hold onto its past. Seventy-five years later, these are the myths and legends from which new forms of performance are created.
